NCSE announces a 7.6% increase in SNA allocations to schools

NCSE publishes outcome of appeals process for 2014

1. SNA posts

The National Council for Special Education welcomes the announcement by the Minister for Education and Skills, Jan O'Sullivan T.D., that additional Special Needs Assistant posts are being made available for allocation for the forthcoming school year.

On foot of this announcement, the NCSE has sanctioned 666¹ additional posts to primary, special and post-primary schools for next September – the total number of SNA posts is now 11,820 – an increase of 7.6%.

The NCSE has additional SNA posts for use in response to emerging urgent demand during the next school year.

2. Analysis of formal appeals received in 2014

In 2014, the NCSE processed over 24,000 applications from schools for resource teaching and SNA support for the 2014/15 school year. NCSE operates an appeals process for decisions on these applications. By end December 2014, 96 (0.4% of applications) appeals were received – this represents a reduction of 42% over the equivalent 2013 figure.

Notes to Editors

1. The government has increased the number of SNA posts available for allocation to schools from 11,330 to 11,940 – this is an increase of 610 posts.

There are 11,154 SNA posts in schools at present. Next September, this will increase to 11,820 – an increase of 666 posts.

120 posts will be available to the NCSE to enable it respond to emerging demand during the course of the 2015/2016 school year.
