

Eamon Stack Chairperson	<p>Eamon was Chief Inspector in the Department of Education and Skills (DES) from 1997 to 2009. As Chief Inspector, he played a significant role in the reform of the Inspectorate, the introduction of Whole School Evaluation (WSE), the establishment of the National Education Psychological Service (NEPS), the National Council for Special Education (NCSE) and the State Examinations Commission (SEC).</p> <p>This is his second term as Chairperson of the NCSE. He also chaired a working group that was asked to develop a proposed new model for allocating teaching resources for students with special educational needs to mainstream schools. The report of this working group is entitled: Delivery for Students with Special Educational Needs - a better and more equitable way.</p> <p>Prior to his time in the DES, he was the founding principal of a co-educational community college in Limerick (1978-1992). Enrolment in the school increased from 90 to 1,000 students in the first ten years. Between 1971 and 1978 he was a post-primary teacher of business studies subjects. He is also the author of many books and articles on business studies and economics.</p> <p>Since his retirement from the DES, Eamon has done some work as a facilitator, mediator, coach and adviser on many educational matters.</p> <p>Eamon is also member of the Governing Authority (An tÚdarás Rialaithe) of Mary Immaculate College (MIC), Limerick.</p>
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
