## How to Draw a Cartoon Frog

## A resource for teachers within the 'Spring' theme for learning.

A fun step by step drawing activity for $3^{\text {rd }}-6{ }^{\text {th }}$ class that develops vocabulary, listening and attention skills, ability to following directions and builds student's confidence.

## HOW TO USE THIS RESOURCE

1. As you guide students through the warm up and drawing activity, model/ teach any new vocabulary, prepositions, adjectives etc. as you draw and ask students to copy. (Some suggestions are bolded in the directions below)

| At the top of the oval, draw two arcs, leave a finger space between them <br> Then draw a closed arc inside each of the bigger arcs. <br> At the bottom right hand corner of the closed arcs draw a black circle. <br> These are the frog's eyes! | Draw a curved lines to draw a smile on the frog's face. <br> Draw a small upside down closed arc to draw a tongue. <br> Draw a curved line to join the frogs face to the edge of the frog's legs. | Draw two small circles for his nose. <br> Draw a curved line from the frog's legs to the straight line to make his back feet. <br> Then draw two triangle shapes below the horizonatal line. |
